

Salt Lake County Equestrian Park Policy on

Horseshoeing in the Park

The following is a reminder of rules pertaining to showing horses in the park.

We have a lot of people who use our facility every day. Most of them are related to the daily care of horses. We try our best to accommodate everyone's individual needs without compromising the rights and needs of other boarders and users of the park.

In trying to be accommodating to everyone, we allow horseshoeing in the park and want to continue to do so. However, we would appreciate if you would inform your farriers of a few basic rules that are simply common sense.

All areas in which the horses are shod need to be cleaned up after the shoeing is done. **This includes all old nails and shoes.**

The County does not own any cross-ties in the barns, and there are no community cross-ties. If you are using cross-ties and do not own them, make sure you have the permission of the owners.

Be courteous as to where you shoe your horses and clean-up any mess you make.

ABSOLUTELY, NO SHOEING HORSES IN THE SHOW BARN.

PLEASE INFORM YOUR FARRIER THAT THEY WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOE IN THE SHOW BARN. THIS INCLUDES THE WASHPADS, BOTH INSIDE AND OUT.

REMEMBER - horseshoeing at the County Equestrian Park is a privilege not a right.

If your farrier cannot comply with the rules and be courteous to everyone, they will not be allowed to shoe in the park.
