

Salt Lake County Equestrian Park Rule Enforcement

Park Attendants:

Park attendants are responsible for the general safety of the facilities, boarders, users and welfare of the animals. They are also responsible for the care and use of the facility, collection of monies and the enforcement of Park Policy for the safety and enjoyment of our clients. They are empowered to use their judgment to make sure the above responsibilities are provided for. Immediate cooperation with their decisions is mandatory. Failure to comply with Park Attendants may result in facility users losing riding privileges and may result in eviction from the Park. Please see park policy 18. Violation of Park Policy.

If you feel threatened or have hold something stolen or you witness someone committing a crime or drinking unapproved alcohol within in the park we ask that you contact South Jordan Police Department at 801-840-4000 for non-emergencies and 801-911 for emergencies.

Violation of Rules and Eviction from the Park Policy:

The Salt Lake County Equestrian Park reserves the right to refuse service to anyone. Termination of boarding agreement or removal of park privileges shall be determined by the park management.

- Any individual, boarder, or patron of the Equestrian Park whom is classified as a chronic rule breaker, will be evicted from the park with the associated loss of park boarding and usage privileges.

A chronic rule breaker will be defined as but not limited to:

1. Anyone whom warrants and receives two written warnings regarding a particular rule violation
 2. Or anyone whom warrants and receives three written warnings regarding any combination of rule violations.
- **It is the boarders responsibility to keep current with their monthly payments.** Any boarder or user who has an outstanding balance over 90 days or appears a total of 3 times on the aging list within a rolling year, will be evicted from the park, animals impounded and their paperwork forwarded to the Salt Lake County Attorney's Office for collection. Pursuant to the Animal Boarding and Stall Rental/Permit Agreement the boarder will be responsible for attorney and collection fees. (Salt Lake County reserves the right to impound animals and equipment for public auction to recover late payments and prior debt.)

Please remember that usage of the Equestrian Park is a privilege, not a right.

Protests of Rules Enforcement

Any patron can protest eviction or rules enforcement by following the steps below.

1. All protest must be filed with our office within 24 hours of rules enforcement.
2. Turn in your written, signed, & dated appeal with \$20.00 (non refundable) fee.
3. An independent advisory council will meet and discuss the appeal. All recommendations of the advisory council will be final.
